Parish Penitential Service Thursday,14th March 7 - 8 pm. Essential Elements of a Good Confession

Preparation - A good examination of our consciences, know and identify your sins, how many times, what occasions, and what led to them. We can use the Ten Commandments, the beatitudes, or any other scripture passage or something that suits us best to examine our lives.

Contrition - Be truly sorry for your sins. The essential act of Penance, on the part of the penitent, is contrition - sorrow, a clear and decisive rejection of the sin committed, together with a resolution not to commit it again, out of the love one has for God and which is reborn with repentance.

Confession - The confession (or disclosure) of sins, even from a simply human point of view, frees us and facilitates our reconciliation with God and one another. Every sin is a sin against God and one another. Through such an admission we look squarely at the sins we are guilty of. We take responsibility for them, and thereby open ourselves again to God and to the communion of the Church, and others in order to make a new future possible.

Absolution – By going to a priest for absolution, we recognise the action of Christ. For Christ commissioned His disciples to do so. It is not the priest who forgives, but God. The priest is a mere shameful instrument, suffering servant for the saving work of God. To deny this is to deny the presence, and the healing and saving work of Christ.

Reparation / satisfaction - An important part of our healing is the "penance" the priest imposes in reparation for our sins. It is an expression of our determination to amend our lives and so we seek God's grace, for we know with God nothing is impossible. After confessing you return to your seat and fulfil the penance given.

Making your confession

- **Step 1:** 'Bless me Father for I have sinned'
- **Step 2:** Say when did you made your last confession, or to that effect
- Step 3: 'These are my sins ... you say your sins
- **Step 4:** 'For these and all since I have forgotten, and not conscious of, by volition or omission, I ask for forgiveness and penance'
- **Step 5:** Listen to the advice the priest gives
- **Step 6:** Carefully listen / ask if not sure, for your penance
- **Step 7:** Act of contrition: O my God, because You are so good, I am truly sorry that I have sinned against You. With the help of Your Grace, I am determined not to sin again. Amen.'
- **Step 8:** Bow your head and receive the absolution from the priest
- **Step 9:** Return back to your seat and prayerfully fulfil your penance. You are most welcome to light a candle and pray for all who seek forgiveness on this day and for the priests who are at the service of the sacrament today.

Hints for a Good Examination of Conscience: What is my relation ship with God: My prayer life, importance of Sunday masses, what has been my motif in taking part in masses and prayers. How do I treat my body and myself: As a gift of God, respectful, caring, with no excess indulgences. How do I treat others: Do I treat them as children of God. Am I prejudiced, uncaring and unrespectful. Worked for what is paid. Do I failed to give ones due, be unjust but do charity. Do I do justice to God, to church. Have I mislead the young and the Children: maliciously talking bad of the church, the priest and the sacraments and so misguiding and misdirecting them and the vulnerable.

CTK 'Churches Together in England is a national ecumenical organisation supporting and encouraging Christian churches from a wide range of traditions to work together in unity. There are six presidents of the national organisation, including Cardinal Vincent Nichols. In Kidlington representatives from St Thomas More's and the Anglican, Methodist and Baptist churches meet several times a year, working collaboratively in different ways to share Gods love and witness to his presence.
