Fr Prem's message: This will be my last message to the parish, and the next weekend 4th / 5th October the last masses. Just one thing to say, as said on the parish poster 'So long, farewell, Goodbye'. I am deeply thankful to one and all for all your welcome and all the support valuing my priestly calling and ministry all the while. Without which, as I preached in my first sermons, a priest would not be able to function his priestly ministry, live his charism and so the community, culture and country to be enriched.

It is, has been and always shall be a challenging time and all times, to faiths and clergy. Especially to celebate ministry as is in the Catholic church and it abounds when you are considered, treated and tagged as not one's own. At times it is more as it is in the present 'all out' or 'one in, one out'. It is dooms day when it is within religion, the church,... for there would be nothing to save the world! It is worst when it is within and when the leaders fail. It brings a tear when people are marginalised, treated with prejudice, divided against own brothers and sisters. Will the west be held accountable for it? 'Not so!'.

There has been challenging times here in my ministry in the parish together with the chaplaincy. Some quite visible, some not so or not known at all, but the parish has always stood by me trusting in me and valuing my ministry here in the parish. The worst for a priest is to take away all the means to fulfil his priestly ministry as he wishes, according to what he values and not simply do as is told, or not as someone wants. Religious freedom and ones free will in all that matters in life is fundamental for any flourishing of a person, community, country and a culture with any civility. It is paramount to a priest. I thank you for allowing me to exercise it to the best I could, fully I believe! You stood by me.

It is not made known yet to me as to who would replace me. Like me you too must be praying very much to know who it is, sooner than later, not left to be in a 'dilapidated state' a wish to be reported as is sought out at the corner. I know you would extend a warm welcome to the new priest, when he comes, valuing his priestly ministry one in substance, unique in character, different in nature in its varying shades, 'charisms' the buzz word it seems! However ancient it is. Good! I know you value the priest. The sacrament. One in the family of God not different. Without which there is no church, there is no faith. Yes the community will and always will be. As I said in my first report to the parish assembly it is the priest and the community that makes the church sacramentally present to one another. Without which they exist but not a sacramental presence. There would be no 'awe and the wonder', yes together I believe, we lived the wonder of God in the parish and the school, and you shall continue to do so. Thank you. I trust you were entertained, thrilled, enjoyed and benefited with such understanding. Me too. Thank you. Goodbye!


